6. Governance, Leadership and Management

6.1 State the Vision and Mission of the institution

VISION: To be a Respective University by imparting research focussed education in all the disciplines to increase Access, Equity and Quality of education

MISSION: IFTM University is committed to provide peaceful and serene environment for skill development and knowledge building by emphasizing on teaching, engaging in research, participating in various community activities and collaborating with local/national Organisations of repute for the development of youth.

6.2 Does the Institution has a management Information System

The University has the ERP system for the following functions: Admission Process, Fee Collection, Salary Distribution and Examination and the library is computerised and automated for issuing books etc, Tally is used for Accounts.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

The University provides complete autonomy to the departments/faculties to revise or update existing curriculum to incorporate latest knowledge development and even introduce new programmes in tune with employment market needs, as and when they want to do this. All departments have BOS and Faculty Board for the curriculum development. Departments have 'Departmental Advisory Committee' for curriculum development. The minutes approved in BOS and FB are placed in Academic Council which approves them.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Orientation Programme is mandatory for all the departments. The assignments are given to the students. Remedial classes are conducted for the slow learners and they are given handout/notes and question banks to improve their performance in University Examination. Mentor –Mentee system is in practice. Result is evaluated periodically by individual faculty member. Student centric learning is imparted through use of ICT and Use of open source learning.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Faculty takes class tests as per the Academic Calendar. Marks are submitted on ERP system. Online system for filling examination forms and issue of admit cards. MCQs have been introduced in the University question papers of UG courses and in some PG courses to analyse the conceptual clarity of the students. The result is declared online with-in one week

6.3.4 Research and Development

- 1. University facilitates faculty for participation in the research training programmes at premier institutes like IITs etc.

- 3. Fee waiver of 30% to the faculty pursuing PhD from the University.
- 4. The increased hour accessibility to the Central Library for the faculty members so that the faculty can refer journals.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

The Central Library and departmental libraries are constantly equipped with latest arrivals. The increased hour accessibility to the Central Library with more than 80 thousands books and a good number of journals, magazines, fortnights, weeklies and news papers in different languages ensure full support to research. Besides printed books, it has e-journals, CDs and online database also. The library operations are automated.

University is providing ICT facilities through IT- Division. The internet facility is available in all the departments and hostels and staff quarters. The whole campus is Wi-Fi enabled. All the departments have OFC connectivity.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

The University has set high standards for imparting quality education and thus focus on highly qualified and self motivated faculty members and technical staff who are dedicated towards high quality standards. All the faculty members inducted are qualified and competent in their specialisation.

The University has a well defined policy to academically recharge and rejuvenate teachers, for e.g. providing research grants, study leave, nomination to national/international conferences/seminars, in-service training, organising national/international seminars and workshops etc. They are provided with financial support towards travel and registration. Most of these faculty members are at an advanced stage of completing their research work. The non teaching staffs has been motivated for the higher qualifications and they have attained it during the last five years

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

This is in accordance with the provisions of ordinance of University governing the recruitment of staff in the IFTM University. The Faculty members are recruited as per the guidelines of UGC and different Regulatory Agencies, for e.g. PCI etc. It is done through duly constituted selection committee formed by the Vice Chancellor which includes external experts from various reputed Universities.

Feedback Analysis

Feedback system is an important device employed the university to improve itself and reframe the curriculum, change the teaching techniques and adapt to global market needs.

- Student Feedback: IFTM University collects student feedback at the end of every semester to assess the performance of teachers on various parameters related to the curriculum and its contents and how does faculty teaches etc. On the basis of this feedback, suggestions are provided to the respective directors who discuss the same with the respective faculty members.
- Teachers Feedback: Feedback from teacher is taken related to the up-gradation of the syllabus in accordance to the industry need which is discussed in the curriculum development.
- Employers Feedback: Feedback is taken from different employers who recruit the students from our University. On the basis of this feedback, students are nurtured so that they can perform better.
- Alumni Feedback: University is in the process of having a Registered Alumni Association. After the process is completed more structured response from Alumni would be possible. At present University gets the feedback through informal process from Alumni who are in contact with the University and visit University for various purposes. Some Alumni are also employed in the University as a faculty. The Alumni are asked about the relevance of the courses taught and the university and the need to constantly revise the curriculum at the time of Convocation when they come to receive their degrees.
- Parents Feedback: University always keeps in contact with the parents of the students
 to maintain the discipline and overall contribution by a student in his/her social
 environment. They are constantly in touch with the university authorities like DSW and
 Chief Proctor and the different mentors.
